HOUSE AMENDMENT "JJ" to H.P. 1402, L.D. 1985, Bill, "An Act to Make Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1992 and June 30, 1993 and to Change Certain Provisions of Law"

Amend the bill by inserting at the end before the emergency clause the following:

PART OO

Sec. OO-1. Bureau of Intergovernmental Drug Enforcement motor vehicles; Bureau of Purchases. The Bureau of Intergovernmental Drug Enforcement shall transfer all title and interest it has in all but 15 of the motor vehicles used by the Bureau of Intergovernmental Drug Enforcement to the Department of Administration, Bureau of Purchases by December 31, 1991. The Bureau of Purchases shall either include the motor vehicles in the Central Motor Pool or sell the motor vehicles. Any net proceeds must be transferred to the Treasurer of State who shall apply the funds to the amount to be distributed to municipalities on a monthly basis from January 1992 to June 1992 in accordance with the provisions of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 5681, subsection 4.

Sec. OO-2. Bureau of Intergovernmental Drug Enforcement forfeitures; accounting and transfer. The Bureau of Intergovernmental Drug Enforcement shall submit a full accounting of all real and personal property acquired through forfeitures to the Commissioner of Finance no later than January 15, 1992. The accounting must include a description of each piece of property, the date it was acquired through forfeiture and its approximate value. No later than February 1, 1992, the Bureau of Intergovernmental Drug Enforcement shall transfer all title and interest it has in any real and personal property acquired through forfeiture to the Department of Finance. Any net proceeds must be transferred to the Treasurer of State who shall apply the funds to the amount to be distributed to municipalities on a monthly basis from January 1992 to June 1992 in accordance with the provisions of the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 30-A, section 5681, subsection 4.

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FISCAL NOTE

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6 This amendment requires the Bureau of Intergovernmental Drug
Enforcement to transfer certain property acquired through
8 forfeiture to the Department of Finance and all but 15 of its
motor vehicles to the Department of Administration. The net
10 proceeds achieved from these transfers must be distributed to
municipalities through State Municipal Revenue Sharing. The
exact amount of net proceeds can not be determined at this time.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment requires the Bureau of Intergovernmental Drug
Enforcement to transfer all its interests in all but 15 motor
vehicles it holds to the Department of Administration, Bureau of
Purchases. The Bureau of Purchases may either include the motor
vehicles as part of the Central Motor Pool or sell any of the
motor vehicles received from the Bureau of Intergovernmental Drug
Enforcement.

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This amendment also requires the Bureau of Intergovernmental
Drug Enforcement to make a full accounting of all real and
personal property it has acquired through forfeiture proceedings
to the Commissioner of Finance and transfer all title and
interest in the property to the Department of Finance.
