§458. Liquor Enforcement Fund

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The Liquor Enforcement Fund is established as a nonlapsing fund. The fund must be used to pay the costs of the Bureau of

Liquor Licensing and Enforcement for enforcing this Title and the rules adopted pursuant to this title. Twenty percent of the fees

collected for agency liquor store licenses pursuant to section 453-A must be deposited in the Liquor Enforcement Fund.

Sec. OO-15. Transition. The following provisions apply to the reassignment of the duties and responsibilities of the licensing division of the Department of Finance, Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages.

- 1. The Department of Public Safety, Bureau of Liquor Licensing and Enforcement is the successor in every way to the powers, duties and functions of the former licensing division of the Department of Finance, Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages.
- 2. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, all 24 accrued expenditures, assets, liabilities, balances appropriations, allocations, transfers, revenues or available funds in an account or subdivision of an account of the 26 licensing division of the Department of Finance, Bureau of 28 Alcoholic Beverages must be transferred to the proper accounts by the State Controller upon the request of the State Budget Officer and with the approval of the Governor. 30

All rules and procedures in effect, in operation or adopted on the effective date of this Part in or by the former licensing division of the Department of Finance, Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages or any of its officers remain in effect until rescinded, revised or amended by the proper authority.
- 4. All contracts, agreements and compacts in effect on the effective date of this Part in the former licensing division of the Department of Finance, Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages remain in effect.
- 5. Any authorized and allocated positions of the former licensing division of the Department of Finance, Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages that are subject to the personnel laws remain authorized. Authorized positions and incumbent personnel in the licensing division of the Department of Finance, Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages are transferred to the Department of Public Safety, Bureau of Liquor Licensing and Enforcement.

	This amendment has no net fiscal impact in fiscal year
50	1991-92. The net effect on General Fund revenue transferred from

the Alcoholic Beverage Fund in fiscal year 1992-93 can not be determined at this time.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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- The amendment moves the liquor licensing function from the Bureau of Alcoholic Beverages in the Department of Finance to the Bureau of Liquor Enforcement in the Department of Public Safety. The amendment also imposes a \$2,500 annual license fee on agency liquor stores, 20% of which would go to liquor enforcement.
- Finally, the amendment repeals restrictions in the location of 12 state and agency liquor stores and repeals the local referendum
- 14 requirement for all liquor licenses.
