Sec. OO-3. Transfer of functions from Bureau of Human Resources. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, chapter 372, subchapter I, article I, or any other provision of law, the Bureau of Human Resources is authorized to begin transferring its duties and its functions to individual state agencies. Preliminary steps toward the complete transfer of the bureau's functions and duties may begin on the effective date of this Part and must include the adoption of a new uniform hiring policy, as required by federal law. A complete plan must be submitted to the First Regular Session of the 116th Legislature recommending changes to certain provisions of the law necessary to implement this transfer. The transfer of duties must be complete by July 1, 1993.

This amendment transfers some functions of the Bureau of Human Resources to individual state agencies and results in a General Fund deappropriation of \$316,027 to that bureau in fiscal year 1991-92. The bill additionally appropriates \$158,013 to General Purpose Aid for Local Schools in fiscal year 1991-92 and \$158,014 to municipal revenue sharing in fiscal year 1991-92 resulting in no net fiscal impact to the bill.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment deappropriates \$316,027 from the Bureau of Human Resources and appropriates 1/2 of that amount to the Department of Education, General Purpose Aid for Local Schools and 1/2 of that amount to the Office of Treasurer of State, State Municipal Revenue Sharing. The amendment authorizes the bureau to begin transferring its duties and functions to individual state agencies. This transfer must be complete by July 1, 1993.
