HOUSE AMENDMENT " $\rho^{\rho}$ " to H.P. 1402, L.D. 1985, Bill, "An Act to Make Supplemental Appropriations and Allocations for the Expenditures of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 1992 and June 30, 1993 and to Change Certain Provisions of Law"

Amend the bill in Part M by striking out all of sections 1 20 to 5, 14, 21 and 23 to 32.

22 Further amend the bill in Part M by renumbering the sections to read consecutively.

Further amend the bill in Part S by striking out all of sections 30 and 33 to 35.

28 Further amend the bill in Part S by renumbering the sections to read consecutivley.

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Further amend the bill by inserting at the end before the 32 emergency clause the following:

'PART OO

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Sec. OO-1. PL 1991, c. 591, Pt. N, §23 is amended to read:

Sec. N-23. Application. That section of this Part that amends
 Public Law 1989, chapter 530, section 4 applies to tax years
 ending on or after January 1, 1991 <u>and January 1, 1992</u>.

Sec. OO-2. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
