The Department of Human Services shall develop a plan for implementing changes within the child protective services programs to improve the identification of children at risk and the delivery of services to those children and their families and shall report back to the Joint Standing Committee on Human Resources and the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs no later than February 1, 1992 with its proposals. In developing its proposal, the department shall consult with child abuse and neglect councils, the Department of the Attorney General and the Joint
