Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, an error was made in assembling the engrossed version of L.D. 1985, which became Public Law 1991, chapter 622; and

Whereas, the error needs to be corrected immediately in 10 order that the law correctly reflects the actions of this Legislature; and

Whereas, this change must take effect immediately; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. PL 1991, c. 622, Pt. H is repealed.

Sec. 2. PL 1991, c. 622, Pt. PP is repealed.

Sec. 3. Retroactivity. This Act is retroactive to December 23, 1991.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill corrects an error that occurred in the assembly of the engrossed version of L.D. 1985, which became PL 1991, c.
622. As a result of this error the remainder of Part H which was stricken by House Amendment "C" was not deleted, and Part PP was
incorrectly appended to the bill. This bill corrects the error and conforms the laws by repealing Parts H and PP and is
retroactive to the date Public Law 1991, chapter 622 was approved.
