An Act to Benefit Consumers by Clarifying Directory Advertising for
Osteopathic and Allopathic Physicians.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

35-A MRSA §7501-B is enacted to read:

4
6 **§7501-B. Organization of directories for osteopathic and
allopathic physicians**

8 When a telephone utility or an affiliate of a public utility
10 publishes a directory of customers' names, addresses and
12 telephone numbers or a directory of advertising, the utility or
14 the affiliate shall include all osteopathic and allopathic
physicians under one heading entitled "Physicians and Surgeons."
Osteopathic physicians may be distinguished in the directory with
the letters "D.O." after their names.

18 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

20 This bill requires telephone utilities and affiliates that
22 publish directories to list osteopathic physicians and allopathic
physicians under the listing of "Physicians and Surgeons."
