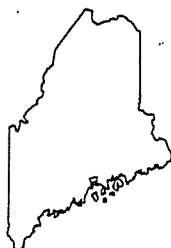

**An Act to Restore Maine State Retirement Service Credit to Certain  
Part-time, Seasonal, Intermittent or Legislative Employees.**

---



2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:**

4 **Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §17751, sub-§3,** as enacted by PL 1985, c. 801,  
§§5 and 7, is amended to read:

6 **3. Board determination.** The board shall determine by  
appropriate rules how much service in any year qualifies for one  
8 year's service credit. Beginning July 1, 1991, any rule change  
that has the effect of reducing benefits applies only to new  
10 members first employed after its effective date. Service  
rendered for the full normal working time in any year qualifies  
12 for one year's service credit.

14 **Sec. 2. Retroactivity.** This Act applies retroactively to July  
1, 1991.

18 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

20 This bill restores the method of calculating annual service  
credit to certain part-time, seasonal, intermittent or  
22 legislative employees in effect prior to July 1, 1991.
