### **STATE OF MAINE**

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-TWO

An Act to Change the Legislative Reporting Requirements of the Mandated Benefits Advisory Commission.

#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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24 MRSA §2325-B, sub-§5,  $\PC$ , as enacted by PL 1989, c. 556, Pt. A, §2, is amended to read:

C. The commission shall perform assessments of proposed and existing mandated benefits and other studies of mandated benefits issues as requested by the Legislature pursuant to Title 24-A, section 2751. The commission shall strictly adhere to the reporting deadlines established by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over insurance matters for all legislation referred to the commission for study. Failure to meet these deadlines results in the automatic, immediate return of the legislation under study to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over insurance matters for disposition of the legislation.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

22 This bill requires the Mandated Benefits Advisory Commission to strictly adhere to the reporting deadlines set by the joint 24 standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over insurance matters for each piece of legislation referred to the 26 commission for study. Failure to meet these deadlines means an automatic and immediate return of the measure under study to the 28 legislative committee of jurisdiction for ultimate disposition of the bill.
