IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-TWO

An Act to Require Reporting of Daily Routine Releases of Radioactive Materials.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 35-A MRSA §4332, sub-§2, ¶¶B and C, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 141, Pt. A, §6, are amended to read:

- B. Unscheduled releases of radioactive materials, as soon as possible, but not more than 24 hours after the discovery of the release; and
- C. Breakdowns or malfunctions of any safety--related safety-related equipment that must be reported under the
   United-States 10 Code of Federal Regulations, Title-10, Part 21, as soon as possible, but not more than 24 hours after
   the discovery of the breakdown or malfunction; and
- 16 Sec. 2. 35-A MRSA §4332, sub-§2, ¶D is enacted to read:
  - D. Routine or continuous emissions of radioactive materials for every 24-hour period, within the next 24-hour period.

Sec. 3. 35-A MRSA §4332, sub-§3, ¶A, as enacted by PL 1987, c. 141, Pt. A, §6, is amended to read:

 A. The total amount of radioactivity released or planned or estimated to be released. If notice is required pursuant to subsection 2, paragraph A, additional notice must be given within 24 hours after the release describing the total amount of radioactivity actually released;

## STATEMENT OF FACT

34 This bill changes the provisions requiring a nuclear power plant to provide notice of releases of radioactive materials.
36 This bill requires notice of routine or continuous emissions of radioactive materials in every 24-hour period to be made within 38 the next 24-hour period. The bill also provides that notice of a scheduled release be followed up by notice describing the actual 40 release within 24 hours of the release.
