Resolve, to Assist High-risk Students.

Report; funding proposals. Resolved: That on or before 2 February 1, 1993, the Department of Education shall file a report with the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters that describes the number of 4 students in public schools, kindergarten to grade 12, who face a high risk of failure but do not qualify as special education 6 students and require significantly more educational effort than 8 the average student to enable them to meet the State's educational standards. 10 The report must include, at a minimum: 12 1. The criteria for identifying such students; 14 2. A means of measuring the cost of the additional educational effort required for such students; and 16 18 Proposed legislation to fund all or some of the 3. additional costs required for such students with state funds 20 beginning on July 1, 1993. 22 In preparing the report, the department shall solicit information and commentary from each school administrative unit. 24 The funding mechanisms proposed by the department must 26 include at least one proposal that would reallocate existing or proposed state funding for education in such a way that additional appropriation is not required. 28 30 32 STATEMENT OF FACT 34 The purpose of this resolve is to assist high-risk students who do not qualify as special education students but who need 36 considerably more help than an average student, and who, as a This resolve requires the result, cost more to educate. Department of Education to report to the joint standing committee 38 of the Legislature having jurisdiction over education matters 40 with recommendations, including proposed legislation, that establish criteria for identifying high-risk students and a 42 method of providing some additional funding for them beginning on July 1, 1993. 44

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
