IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-TWO

An Act Concerning the Stocking of Atlantic Salmon in Maine Rivers.

(EMERGENCY)

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2	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
4	as emergencies; and
6	Whereas, the stocking program authorized in this legislation requires rulemaking before the program may be implemented; and
8	Whereas, preparation for the next fishing season must begin well in advance of the 90-day period; and

12	Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately

16	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
18	12 MRSA §7675 is enacted to read:

22	§7675. Aquaculture stock
24	1. Acceptance of stock. The department shall accept salmon stock that are offered at no charge from commercial aquaculture
<i>-</i> -	hatcheries for release into state rivers subject to rules
26	developed by the department.
28	2. Rules. The department shall adopt rules to implement
20	this section. They must, at a minimum:
30	A Proper that we receive impact or emisting gave mode
32	A. Ensure that no negative impact on existing gene pools results from the release of aquaculturally raised salmon;
34	B. Prohibit introduction of exotic species from the release of aquaculturally raised salmon;
36	C. Establish stock disease testing and monitoring

40	D. Establish maximum stocking levels in state rivers.  Notwithstanding subsection 1, the department is not required
42	to accept salmon stock if maximum stocking levels are achieved, as long as those levels are maintained.
