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12	STATEMENT OF FACT
14	This amendment eliminates the ambulance service and first responder service members of the 13-member Emergency Medical
16	Services Board and replaces them with a 2nd physician, nurse and member of the public. It also requires that the regional members
18	of the board, of which there are currently 6 members, must be members of a profession regulated by the board or members of the
20	general public. Currently, there are no qualifications for these members. The amendment also adds a fiscal note.
