STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-TWO

An Act to Amend the Laws Governing Emergency Medical Technicians.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §85, sub-§2, as amended by PL 1991, c. 588, 4 §13, is further amended to read:

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2. Advanced emergency medical treatment. With the advice and consultation noted in subsection 1, the board may provide, by rule, which advanced skills, techniques and judgments may be supervised by a physician by means of standing orders, by voice radio and by other means. Nothing in this section may preclude protocols in a particular region from imposing controls more strict than those permitted by the board's rules on the use of a skill, technique or judgment. In every case, advanced emergency medical treatment must be given in accordance with protocols.

16 The board may establish by rule appropriate licensure levels for advanced emergency medical technicians and fix the qualifications 18 for persons to hold those licenses.

38 persons, the board shall ensure that a person is not licensed to care for patients unless that person's qualifications are at
40 least those specified in this subsection. Any person who meets these conditions is considered to have the credentials and skill
42 demonstrations necessary for the ambulance attendant level of licensure to provide basic emergency medical treatment.

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The person must have completed successfully the United Α. 46 Department of Transportation course for States first responders, with supplemental training specified in rules 48 adopted by the board pursuant to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, or completed successfully the American Red Cross Advanced First Aid and Emergency Care Course, with 50 supplemental training specified in rules adopted by the 52 board pursuant to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act.

STATEMENT OF FACT

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This bill gives the Emergency Medical Services Board the authority to set by rule the interval license and relicensing requirements for emergency medical persons.
