IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-TWO

An Act to Protect Low-income Households from Hardships Due to Delays in the Receipt of Home Energy Assistance Program Funds from the Federal Government.

(EMERGENCY)

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**Emergency preamble. Whereas,** Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the health and safety of low-income households may be jeopardized by expected delays in the receipt of Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program, or LIHEAP, funds due to delays in approval of the federal budget; and

 Whereas, weather forecasters are predicting a cold winter for Maine, which may create serious hardships for an estimated
 60,000 Maine households who are eligible for LIHEAP; and

14 Whereas, the early availability of funds for LIHEAP is essential to prevent needless suffering and the risk of persons
 16 freezing to death due to the lack of fuel for home heating; and

18 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of 20 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and 22 safety; now, therefore,

- 24 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
- 26 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §3518-B, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 884, §1, is amended to read:
  - §3518-B. Energy Assistance Reserve Fund
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Energy Assistance Reserve Fund. The division shall use 1. 32 funds appropriated pursuant to this section to establish and capitalize the Fuel Energy Assistance Reserve Fund. The division 34 shall keep the Fuel-Assistance-Reserve-Fund fund separate from all other funds managed by the division and use the fund only, 36 without exception, under the conditions set forth in this section. The Division-of--Community-Services division shall use 38 the Fuel--Assistance--Reserve--Fund fund to ensure that fuel assistance benefits under the home energy assistance program and 40 the energy crisis intervention program for the State's eligible elderly and low-income residents are available prior to the beginning of the heating season. The fund may not be used for 42 the weatherization assistance program and the central heating 44 improvement program.

46 2. Timely distribution of benefits. The--Division--of
 Community-Services For at least the months of October, November
 48 and December, the division shall make available to local program
 operators and municipal administrators of the fuel assistance
 50 program, no later than October-lst-of-cach-year the first of each

of those months, funds sufficient to cover anticipated fuel assistance payments <u>under the home energy assistance program and</u> the energy crisis intervention program and program administrative costs for at-least-the <u>each of those</u> months ef-October,-November and-December.

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3. Conditional use of the fund. The division's use of the fund is subject to the following conditions and limitations.

A. If the director reasonably anticipates that federal fuel assistance block grant funds are not available for distribution to the local program operators and municipal administrators by October 1st of each year, the division shall withdraw and distribute sufficient money from the fund as is necessary for the purposes set forth in this section. The division may withdraw funds prior to October 1st, provided that those funds are used only for costs incurred on or after October 1st.

Money may not be withdrawn from the fund if sufficient block grant funds are available to pay reasonably anticipated fuel
 assistance program and administrative costs as set forth in this section for the months of October, November and December.

B. Money withdrawn from the fund must be sufficient to cover anticipated fuel-assistance payments <u>under the home</u> <u>energy assistance program and the energy crisis intervention</u> <u>program</u> and fuel-assistance program administrative costs for all local program operators and municipal administrators for the months of October, November and December.

C. The division may not withdraw money from the fund between--October--Ist--and--June--30th <u>after receipt of the federal block grant funds</u>.

D. The fund may not be used if the Director-of-Community Services <u>director</u> knows, or is reasonably certain, that no federal fuel assistance money will be received.

4. Recapitalization. If money is withdrawn from the fund
 42 for the purposes of this section, the Division--of--Community
 Services <u>division</u> shall ensure that the fund is fully
 44 recapitalized by June-30,-1991 <u>September 30, 1992</u>.

46 5. Expiration of fund. Authorization for the fund expires on June-30,-1991 September 30, 1992. The division shall ensure
48 that the fund is fully recapitalized and that all money in the fund is transferred to the General Fund no later than June-30,
50 1991 September 30, 1992.

#### Sec. 2. PL 1989, c. 884, §2 is amended to read:

Sec. 2. Working capital advance. The State Controller is 4 authorized to advance to the Executive Department, Division of Community Services, \$8,000,000 from the General Fund to the Fuel Energy Assistance Reserve Fund. These funds will be used to 6 provide the working capital advance necessary to make timely fuel 8 assistance payments under the home energy assistance program and the energy crisis intervention program to elderly and low-income residents until receipt of Low-income Low-Income Home Energy 10 Assistance Block Grant funds. Funds advanced for this purpose 12 must be returned to the General Fund no later than June-30,-1991 September 30, 1992, pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 14 5, section 3518-B, subsection 5.

Sec. 3. Allocation. The following funds are allocated from Other Special Revenue to carry out the purposes of this Act.

- 28 Provides funds for the expenditures from the Energy 30 Assistance Reserve Fund, pursuant to the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 32 3518-B, to provide a working 34 capital advance in anticipation of federal fuel 36 assistance block grant funds.
- 38 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

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# STATEMENT OF FACT

44 This bill changes the Fuel Assistance Reserve Fund to the Energy Assistance Reserve Fund and allocates \$6,000,000 to the 46 state agency with responsibility for administering the Low-Income Home Energy Assistance Program, or LIHEAP, to be used as start-up 48 funding for the program pending the receipt of federal funding. The start-up funds are necessary to ensure that eligible 50 recipients of LIHEAP grants receive them in a timely fashion at the beginning of the winter heating season.

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
