method by which persons charged with the violation of parking regulations may waive all court action by payment of specified fees within specified periods of time. Said <u>These</u> regulations may provide that a vehicle unlawfully parked shall-be <u>is</u> prima facie evidence of the unlawful parking of such <u>the</u> vehicle by the person in whose name such <u>the</u> vehicle is registered. <u>The specified fee for any violation must be at least \$10</u>.

Any person found guilty of violating any rule made pursuant to sections 2904 to 2907 shall, upon conviction, pay a fine of not less than \$10 \$30\$ for each offense.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill makes the minimum fee, which is set by rule by the Commissioner of Public Safety, for violating a parking regulation on state controlled property within the capitol area a \$10 fine.

Payment of the fee allows the violator to waive any court action. The bill raises the minimum fine that a violator may receive upon conviction in District Court to \$30.
