An Act to Establish the Petroleum Market Share Act.

10	This chapter may be known and cited as the "Petroleum Market Share Act."

44	§1673. Reporting
46	1. Report by wholesaler. Each wholesaler shall provide
48	reports to the Department of the Attorney General in a manner, frequency, time and form specified by the Attorney General,
	setting forth the total gallons of home heating oil and motor
50	fuel oil sold by the wholesaler to each retail outlet or retailer.

2. Report by retailer. Each retailer of home heating oil shall provide reports to the Department of the Attorney General in a manner, frequency, time and form specified by the Attorney General, setting forth the total gallons of home heating oil sold to customers in any municipality from each of its retail outlets.

§1674. Investigations by Attorney General

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The Attorney General may require, by summons, the attendance and testimony of witnesses and the production of books and papers related to the Attorney General's determination of the market shares held by retailers. Summonses must be served in the same manner as summonses for witnesses in criminal cases and all provisions of law related to that service apply to summonses issued under this section so far as they are applicable. All investigations or hearings pursuant to this chapter must be held in Kennebec County or in such other county as the Attorney General designates. Any Justice of the Superior Court may, by order, upon application of the Attorney General, compel the attendance of witnesses, the production of books and papers and the giving of testimony before the Attorney General in the same manner and to the same extent as before that court. Failure to obey such an order of the court may be punishable by the court as a contempt of court.

§1675. Confidentiality

§1676. Report by Attorney General to Legislature

Annually by December 31st, the Attorney General shall make a report to the Legislature describing the concentration among retail outlets in the State or in sections of the State but without disclosing the name of any particular retailer or retail outlet. The Attorney General shall include in the annual report a recommendation to the Legislature as to whether additional legislation is needed to limit or curtail the activity of refiners operating retail outlets.

\$1677. Penalties and injunctive actions

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Violation of this chapter is a civil violation for which a civil penalty not to exceed \$50,000 per violation may be assessed. The Attorney General may initiate an action in Superior Court for injunctive and other equitable relief to enforce compliance with this chapter. In any action commenced by the Attorney General under this chapter either for injunctive and other equitable relief or for civil penalties, the Attorney General, if on the prevailing side, must be awarded necessary and
