- Sec. 2. 12 MRSA $\S8901$, sub- $\S3$, as amended by PL 1987, c. 816, Pt. KK, $\S15$, is further amended to read:
- 3. Law enforcement powers. Forest rangers and the state supervisor, for the purpose of enforcing forest and forest preservation laws and, laws of the Maine Land Use Regulation Commission and laws and rules relating to the lands under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Public Lands, shall have the law enforcement powers equivalent to a sheriff or sheriff's deputy, including the right to arrest violators, prosecute the—same violators, serve criminal process against offenders, require aid in executing forest ranger duties and deputize temporary aides.

STATEMENT OF FACT

In keeping with the existing powers and responsibilities of
Maine Forest Service rangers, this bill enables rangers to
enforce the rules and laws governing the use of the State's
public lands that are under the jurisdiction of the Bureau of
Public Lands. This authorization will enable rangers to provide
law enforcement assistance to the Bureau of Public Lands on those
occasions when such assistance is needed, or when a forest ranger
may be the only readily available law enforcement officer.
