must specify the amount of savings to be achieved, by funding source, as a result of the reduction in administrative personnel.

For the purpose of this section, for all departments and of State Government identified in this section, "administrative personnel" means employees whose primary functions involve: the management or administration of a department, department units or department programs; supervision of employees; policy development; policy implementation; and execution of nondirect service responsibilities and clerical or secretarial duties. The term "administrative personnel" does not apply to employees, such as caseworkers, motor registration employees, mental health workers and prison guards, whose duties or responsibilities primarily involve providing direct services to members of the public or clients of the State or similar types of responsibilities.

Each organization subject to this section shall provide its report no later than February 3, 1992 to the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs. The committee shall review the agency reports and determine the amount of savings that can be incurred.'

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment ensures that all agencies of State Government including the legislative and judicial branches, the Office of the Secretary of State, the Office of the Attorney General, the Office of Treasurer of State, the Office of the State Auditor, the Finance Authority of Maine, the Maine State Housing Authority and all independent agencies and institutions of higher education are subject to the same rules in regard to submission of a plan for a 10% reduction in administrative personnel.
