An Act Concerning the Early Establishment of Counseling for Children in Foster Care.

(EMERGENCY)

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	Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
2	become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

	Whereas, events involving children in extended foster care,
6	such as separation from family, may cause severe stress for the children involved; and
8	Whereas, children should receive counseling as soon as
10	possible after the trauma of being removed from their homes; and

<b>.</b>	4. Permanent plans for care, counseling and custody.
28	Promote the early establishment of permanent plans for the care, counseling and custody of children who eannet can not be returned

34	Title IV-E, who have been in foster care more than 24 months, by 10% each year beginning with the federal fiscal year that starts on October 1, 1983.
