Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting 20 clause and before the statement of fact and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA §1253, sub-§4, as amended by PL 1991, c. 24 259, §1, is further amended to read:

4. Up to an additional 3 days per month may be deducted in the case of those inmates committed to the Department of Corrections who are assigned <u>or participating in</u> work and, <u>education or other</u> responsibilities within the institution or program that are deemed <u>determined</u> to be of sufficient importance to warrant those deductions by the institution head in accordance with policy and guidelines established by the Department of Corrections.

## FISCAL NOTE

The granting of good time by the Department of Corrections may result in some minor cost savings by reducing the length of sentences served in the State's correctional institutions. The amount of savings does not warrant a General Fund deappropriation.'

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The original bill authorized the granting of 2 days of good time per month to persons working toward a high school diploma, learning to read or instructing other inmates.
