Any amount remaining in the suspense account must be transferred to the General Fund prior to the end of the fiscal year. It is the intent that this process be used for fiscal year 1992-93 and that, when the Maine State Retirement System calculates the percentages for future budgets, the State's share be reduced an appropriate amount due to the increased contribution by the employees.

The Director of the Maine State Retirement System shall notify the State Controller of the actual amount of funds the system has received from teachers throughout the State because of the additional 1% withheld from their payroll checks and an estimate of the amount to be collected for the remainder of the fiscal year and the comparable amount that the State can reduce the payment to the Maine State Retirement System for teachers' retirement. The amount remaining in the teachers' retirement

Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services shall adopt rules to allow state employees to make payroll deductions for health care and dependent day-care expenses that qualify as a "cafeteria plan" pursuant to the United States Internal Revenue Code, Section 125, as amended.

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Sec. CCC-1. Calculation and transfer. The State Budget Officer shall cause the calculated amount to be transferred from each account.

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Sec. CCC-2. Implementation; detailed plan. Each department and agency affected by this Part shall submit a detailed implementation plan in accordance with the requirements of sections 1 and 4 of this Part, which must be approved in advance
