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Sec. YY-1. Change to certain state employee pay dates in fiscal year 1992-93. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 10 or any other provision of law, the State Controller is authorized to modify the final pay dates for state employees in Cycle A and Cycle B for the final payrolls effective in fiscal year 1992-93. The State Controller is authorized to change the June 23, 1993 and June 30, 1993 pay dates so that state employees are paid for those pay dates on July 1, 1993.

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Sec. YY-2. Calculation and transfer. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1585, the State Budget Officer shall calculate the amount in sections 3 and 4 of this Part that applies against each General Fund and Highway Fund account for all departments and agencies based on the total General Fund appropriations and Highway Fund allocations to those accounts. The State Budget Officer shall cause the calculated amount to be transferred from each account.

12 compensation in addition to the contribution required under

15 **Sec. ZZ-9. Intent.** It is the intent of this Part that, for
16 each dollar collected from a member of the Maine State Retirement
17 System hired after July 1, 1992, the employer's share must be
18 reduced by a percentage determined by the Maine State Retirement
19 System. The percentage at this time is approximately 80%.

20
21 **Sec. ZZ-10. Transfer of funds.** For members of the Maine State
22 Retirement System hired after July 1, 1992, the State Controller
23 shall withhold from any payroll check paid to the member the full
24 percentage rate or, in cases where the employer is paying the
25 pick-up rate, 1% will be withheld from the employee. The amount
26 equal to the additional 1% deducted from each employee's paycheck
27 under this Part must be retained in the account from which the
28 salary was paid. The amounts retained in the General Fund must
29 be deposited in a suspense account. Part of those funds will be
30 used to pay the Maine State Retirement System. The State
31 Controller shall notify the Maine State Retirement System of the
32 amount withheld from the employee's paycheck in order that the
33 amount may be credited to the employee's account. The State
34 Controller shall pay to the Maine State Retirement System the
35 amount of the employer share, the pick-up amount and the amount
36 in excess of the pick-up share in order to give credit to the
37 employee for the additional 1%. Any amount remaining in the
38 suspense account must be transferred to the General Fund prior to
39 the end of the fiscal year. It is the intent that this process
40 be used for fiscal year 1992-93 and that, when the Maine State
41 Retirement System calculates the percentages for future budgets,
42 the State's share be reduced an appropriate amount due to the
43 increased contribution by the employees.

44
45 The Director of the Maine State Retirement System shall
46 notify the State Controller of the actual amount of funds the

2 system has received from teachers throughout the State because of
the additional 1% withheld from their payroll checks and an
4 estimate of the amount to be collected for the remainder of the
fiscal year and the comparable amount that the State can reduce
6 the payment to the Maine State Retirement System for teachers'
retirement. The amount remaining in the teachers' retirement
8 account must lapse to the General Fund before the end of the
fiscal year. It is the intent that this process be used for
10 fiscal year 1992-93 and that, when the Maine State Retirement
System calculates the percentages for future budgets, the State's
12 share be reduced an appropriate amount due to the increased
contribution by the employee.

14 **Sec. ZZ-11. Application.** This Part applies to persons first
hired by the State after July 1, 1992 and to persons in state
16 service prior to that date who separate from state service and
are rehired after July 1, 1992. It does not apply to persons
18 placed on laid-off status before or after that date who are
recalled to active status after July 1, 1992.

24 **Sec. AAA-1. Salary adjustment.** Notwithstanding any other
provision of law, the annual salary of any person who received at
26 least a 3% cost-of-living salary adjustment on or subsequent to
April 1, 1991 and who is employed by the State, including

of Maine System, the Maine Technical College System and the Maine
30 Maritime Academy, and whose annual salary exceeds \$50,000 is
reduced by 3% effective at the beginning of the pay period

34 Maritime Academy must be used to offset any proposed or
implemented tuition increases.

38 **Sec. AAA-2. Additional salary adjustment.** Notwithstanding any

College System and the Maine Maritime Academy, that exceeds
42 \$50,000 is reduced by 2% effective at the beginning of the pay
period closest to July 1, 1992. Any savings realized by the
44 University of Maine System, the Maine Technical College System
and the Maine Maritime Academy must be used to offset any
46 proposed or implemented tuition increases.

2 **Sec. AAA-3. Calculation and transfer.** Notwithstanding the
3 Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1585, the State Budget
4 Officer is authorized to calculate the amount of savings realized
5 by the application of sections 1 and 2 of this Part that applies
6 against each account. The State Budget Officer shall cause the
7 calculated amount to be transferred from each account and shall
8 forward a report on the distribution to the joint standing
9 committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over
10 appropriations and financial affairs no later than January 15,
11 1993.

7 agency affected by this Part shall submit a detailed
8 implementation plan in accordance with the requirements of
9 sections 1 and 4 of this Part, which must be approved in advance
10 of any implementation by the Commissioner of Administrative and
11 Financial Services, upon the recommendation of the State Budget
12 Officer. The heads of all departments and agencies must prorate
13 the reductions required by sections 1, 6, 7, 8 and 9 of this Part
14 among the line categories in a way to achieve permanent savings
15 and that are in proportion to their existing appropriations and
16 allocations and as excepted by section 1 of this Part. The
17 Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services, in

FISCAL NOTE

This amendment makes a number of changes to General Fund
appropriations and revenues that, in total, will decrease the
total General Fund savings of the bill in fiscal year 1992-93 by
\$24,234. A balanced budget for fiscal year 1991-92 and fiscal
year 1992-93 is maintained. The modification of the pay dates
will create a future cost in fiscal year 1993-94.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment does the following:

1. Achieves additional revenue in the Abandoned Property Program;
2. Amends Part WW in order to remove the repeal of Private and Special Law 1991, chapter 65 and to reduce the "3-hour workweek" proposal from 3 hours to one hour;
3. Makes a number of deappropriations and appropriations to achieve additional General Fund savings;
4. Modifies the final pay dates for state employees in Cycle A and Cycle B in fiscal year 1992-93 only so that each will be paid on July 1, 1993;
5. Implements a 1% increase in contributions to the Maine State Retirement System for new employees;
