Further amend the amendment in Part WW in section 3 in the 5th line (page 337, line 32 in amendment) by striking out the following "3 hours" and inserting in its place the following: 'one hour' and in the 4th line from the end (page 337, line 35 in amendment) by striking out the following: 2 hours and 45 minutes" and inserting in its place the following: 'one hour'

Notwithstanding section 17712, an employee of the Maine 10 State Prison who holds a position described in section 17851, subsection 11 and who is hired after July 1, 1992 shall 12 contribute to the retirement system at a rate of 1% of earnable compensation in addition to the contribution required under 14 section 17712.

Sec. ZZ-9. Intent. It is the intent of this Part that, for each dollar collected from a member of the Maine State Retirement System hired after July 1, 1992, the employer's share must be reduced by a percentage determined by 'the Maine State Retirement System. The percentage at this time is approximately 80%.

22 Sec. ZZ-10. Transfer of funds. For members of the Maine State Retirement System hired after July 1, 1992, the State Controller 24 shall withhold from any payroll check paid to the member the full percentage rate or, in cases where the employer is paying the pick-up rate, 1% will be withheld from the employee. The amount equal to the additional 1% deducted from each employee's paycheck under this Part must be retained in the account from which the salary was paid. The amounts retained in the General Fund must be deposited in a suspense account. Part of those funds will be used to pay the Maine State Retirement System. The State 32 Controller shall notify the Maine State Retirement System of the amount withheld from the employee's paycheck in order that the amount may be credited to the employee's account. The State Controller shall pay to the Maine State Retirement System the amount of the employer share, the pick-up amount and the amount in excess of the pick-up share in order to give credit to the employee for the additional 1%. Any amount remaining in the suspense account must be transferred to the General Fund prior to the end of the fiscal year. It is the intent that this process be used for fiscal year 1992-93 and that, when the Maine State Retirement System calculates the percentages for future budgets, the State's share be reduced an appropriate amount due to the increased contribution by the employees.

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The Director of the Maine State Retirement System shall notify the State Controller of the actual amount of funds the

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system has received from teachers throughout the State because of the additional 1% withheld from their payroll checks and an estimate of the amount to be collected for the remainder of the fiscal year and the comparable amount that the State can reduce the payment to the Maine State Retirement System for teachers' retirement. The amount remaining in the teachers' retirement account must lapse to the General Fund before the end of the fiscal year. It is the intent that this process be used for fiscal year 1992-93 and that, when the Maine State Retirement System calculates the percentages for future budgets, the State's share be reduced an appropriate amount due to the increased contribution by the employee.

Sec. ZZ-11. Application. This Part applies to persons first hired by the State after July 1, 1992 and to persons in state service prior to that date who separate from state service and are rehired after July 1, 1992. It does not apply to persons placed on laid-off status before or after that date who are recalled to active status after July 1, 1992.

Sec. AAA-1. Salary adjustment. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the annual salary of any person who received at least a 3% cost-of-living salary adjustment on or subsequent to April 1, 1991 and who is employed by the State, including probationary employees and including employees of the University of Maine System, the Maine Technical College System and the Maine Maritime Academy, and whose annual salary exceeds \$50,000 is reduced by 3% effective at the beginning of the pay period closest to July 1, 1992. Any savings realized by the University of Maine System, the Maine Technical College System and the Maine Maritime Academy must be used to offset any proposed or implemented tuition increases.

Sec. AAA-2. Additional salary adjustment. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the annual salary of any person employed by the State, including probationary employees and including employees of the University of Maine System, the Maine Technical College System and the Maine Maritime Academy, that exceeds \$50,000 is reduced by 2% effective at the beginning of the pay period closest to July 1, 1992. Any savings realized by the University of Maine System, the Maine Technical College System and the Maine Maritime Academy must be used to offset any proposed or implemented tuition increases.

Sec. AAA-3. Calculation and transfer. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1585, the State Budget Officer is authorized to calculate the amount of savings realized by the application of sections 1 and 2 of this Part that applies against each account. The State Budget Officer shall cause the calculated amount to be transferred from each account and shall forward a report on the distribution to the joint standing committee of Legislature having jurisdiction over the appropriations and financial affairs no later than January 15, 1993.

Sec. AAA-4. Transfer of savings. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1585 or any other provision of law, the State Budget Officer is authorized to transfer \$100,000 of savings from Other Special Revenue, internal service fund and enterprise fund accounts for all departments and agencies occurring as a result of sections 1 to 3 of this Part to the General Fund as undedicated revenue on a periodic basis, but not later than June 30, 1993. The State Budget Officer shall provide a status report on the amounts being transferred to the General Fund by January 15, 1993.

Sec. BBB-1. Pretax accounts for certain state employee benefits. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services shall adopt rules to allow state employees to make payroll deductions for health care and dependent day-care expenses that qualify as a "cafeteria plan" pursuant to the United States Internal Revenue Code, Section 125, as amended.

Sec. CCC-1. Calculation and transfer. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1585, the State Budget 34 Officer shall calculate the amount in sections 6 to 9 of this Part that applies against each General Fund, Other Special 36 Revenue, enterprise or internal service fund account for all 38 departments and agencies based on the total appropriations and allocations to those accounts, except for the following accounts: Aid to Local Schools; Education 40 General Purpose in the Debt Unorganized Territory; Service Treasury; Teacher 42 Retirement; Aid to Families with Dependent Children; Aid to Families with Dependent Children - Foster Care; General 44 Assistance; Maine Health Program; Intermediate Care - Payments to Providers; Medical Care - Payments to Providers; Bureau of Rehabilitation; and Bureau of 46 Rehabilitation -Vocational In addition, the amount of funds appropriated or Rehabilitation. 48 allocated for higher education programs, grants to municipalities

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and schools and grants to public and private organizations are excepted from this calculation. The State Budget Officer shall cause the calculated amount to be transferred from each account.

Sec. CCC-2. Implementation; detailed plan. Each department and agency affected by this Part shall submit a detailed implementation plan in accordance with the requirements of sections 1 and 4 of this Part, which must be approved in advance of any implementation by the Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services, upon the recommendation of the State Budget Officer. The heads of all departments and agencies must prorate the reductions required by sections 1, 6, 7, 8 and 9 of this Part among the line categories in a way to achieve permanent savings and that are in proportion to their existing appropriations and allocations and as excepted by section 1 of this Part. The ' Administrative and Commissioner of Financial Services, in approving each detailed plan, is authorized to adjust the reduction among accounts and line categories only under extenuating circumstances.

Sec. CCC-3. Report. The Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services shall submit a report on the implementation of this Part to the Joint Standing Committee on Appropriations and Financial Affairs no later than September 30, 1992.

Sec. CCC-4. Program or service eliminations. In implementing this Part, the heads of all departments and agencies in State Government, along with the Commissioner of Administrative and Financial Services and the State Budget Officer, shall take all necessary precautions to ensure that no program or service otherwise authorized by the Legislature is eliminated in fiscal year 1992-93 as a result of this Part.

Sec. CCC-5. Transfer of savings. Notwithstanding the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 1585, or any other provision of law, the State Budget Officer is authorized to transfer all savings occurring as a result of sections 7 to 9 of this Part to the General Fund as undedicated revenue on a periodic basis, but not later than June 30, 1993. The State Budget Officer shall provide a status report on the amounts being transferred to the General Fund by January 15, 1993.

Sec. CCC-6. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Part.

FISCAL NOTE

This amendment makes a number of changes to General Fund appropriations and revenues that, in total, will increase the total General Fund savings of the bill in fiscal year 1992-93 by \$150,766. Modifying the payroll dates will create a future cost in fiscal year 1993-94.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment does the following:

36 1. Achieves additional revenue in the Abandoned Property Program;

2. Amends Part WW in order to remove the repeal of Private 40 and Special Law 1991, chapter 65 and to reduce the "3-hour workweek" proposal from 3 hours to one hour;

3. Makes a number of deappropriations and appropriations to 44 achieve additional General Fund savings;

46 4. Modifies the final payroll dates for state employees in
Cycle A and Cycle B in fiscal year 1992-93 only, so that each
cycle will be paid on July 1, 1993;

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5. Implements a 1% increase in contributions to the Maine State Retirement System for new employees;

6. Implements a 3% and 2% salary adjustment for state employees earning more than \$50,000;

 Authorizes "pretax accounts" for certain state employee benefits;

8. Implements a 0.9% across-the-board reduction to certain General Fund, Other Special Revenue, internal service and enterprise accounts.
