COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1553, L.D. 2191, Bill, "An Act to Authorize the Construction of Two Veterans' Homes in Eastern and Western Maine"

Amend the bill by striking out everything after the enacting 18 clause and before the emergency clause and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 37-B MRSA §601, as amended by PL 1989, c. 502, Pt.
A, §141, is further amended to read:

24 §601. Home established; purpose

26 There shall must be public homes for veterans in Maine known as "Maine Veterans' Homes." In addition to the presently 28 existing home located in Augusta, a 120-bed home located in southern Maine and, a home, not to exceed 60 beds, located in 30 Aroostook County, a home located in eastern Maine not to exceed 120 beds and a home located in western Maine not to exceed 120 32 beds may be constructed if federal Veterans' Administration funds are available to meet part of the costs of each facility for 34 construction or operation. The board of trustees shall plan and develop these additional homes and may use any funds available 36 for those purposes, except for the Augusta facility's funded depreciation account. The primary purpose of the homes shall-be 38 is to provide support and care for honorably discharged veterans who served in the United States Armed Forces during wartime, 40 including the Korean Conflict and the Vietnam War.

Sec. 2. 37-B MRSA §602, sub-§6, as amended by PL 1985, c. 773, §2, is further amended to read:

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6. Borrow funds. Borrow funds, not in excess of $$5_7000_7000$ <u>\$15,000,000</u> in the aggregate, make and issue bonds and negotiate

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notes and other evidences of indebtedness or obligations of the veterans' home for prudent and reasonable capital, operational 2 and maintenance purposes. The home may secure payments of all or 4 part of the obligations by pledge of part of the revenues or assets of the home which that are available for pledge and which that may be lawfully pledged or by mortgage of part, or all, of 6 any property owned by the home. The home may do all lawful 8 things necessary and incidental to those powers. The home may borrow money from the Federal Government and its agencies, from state agencies and from any other source. The home may borrow 10 money from the State subject to approval by the Treasurer of 12 State and the Governor. Bonds, notes and other evidences of indebtedness issued under this subsection shall not be deemed to constitute debts of the State, nor a pledge of the credit of the 14 State, but shall be payable solely from the funds of the home; and' 16

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment places the language authorizing the construction of 2 veterans homes in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 37-B, specifies that the beds contained in each home may not exceed 120 and increases the borrowing authority of the Board of Trustees of the Maine Veterans' Homes.
