HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1591, L.D. 2245, Bill, "An Act to Strengthen the Public Disclosure of Lobbying Activities"

Amend the amendment by inserting after section 11 the following:

'Sec. 12. 3 MRSA §318, sub-§3 is enacted to read:

3. Identification. A person may not engage in lobbying unless that person is wearing conspicuously a name tag or other device that identifies the person by name and, if applicable, by the name of the partnership, firm, corporation or professional association by whom the person is regularly employed.'

Further amend the amendment by inserting after section 12 the following:

'Sec. 13. 3 MRSA §319, sub-§4 is enacted to read:

4. Failure to identify. A person who fails to wear proper identification as required by section 318, subsection 3 may be assessed a \$50 fine for each failure.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment requires that a lobbyist wear a name tag or similar device whenever engaged in lobbying. The name tag must state the name of the lobbyist and the lobbyist's regular employer. A failure to wear identification subjects the lobbyist to a possible \$50 fine.
