IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-TWO

An Act to Extend Liability Insurance to Specialized Children's Homes.

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

22 MRSA §8101, sub-§3, as amended by PL 1987, c. 778, §2, is 4 further amended to read:

3. Family foster home. б "Family foster home" means а children's home that is a private dwelling where substitute parental care is provided within a family on a regular, 24-hour a 8 day, residential basis. The total number of children in care may not exceed 6, including the family's legal children under 16 10 years of age, with no more than 2 of these children under the age of 2. Family foster homes and specialized children's homes as 12 defined in subsection 5 licensed by the Department of Human Services or relatives' homes approved by the Department of Human 14 as meeting licensing standards are eligible Services for 16 insurance pursuant to Title 5, section 1728-A. In any action for damages against a family foster home provider insured pursuant to Title 5, section 1728-A, for damages covered under that policy, 18 the claim for and award of those damages, including costs and interest, shall may not exceed \$300,000 for any and all claims 20 arising out of a single occurrence. When the amount awarded to or settled for multiple claimants exceeds the limit imposed by 22 this section, any party may apply to the Superior Court for the county in which the governmental entity is located to allocate to 24 each claimant that claimant's equitable share of the total, limited as required by this section. Any award by the court in 26 excess of the maximum liability limit shall-be is automatically abated by operation of this section to the maximum limit of 28 liability. Nothing in this subsection may be deemed to make the operation of a family foster home a state activity nor may it 30 expand in any way the liability of the State or foster parent.

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STATEMENT OF FACT

36 This bill includes licensed specialized foster homes for children with the already covered family foster homes as eligible 38 for liability insurance under the risk management program. The cost of adding the 3 additional homes will be covered in the 40 existing program.

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
