(EMERGENCY)



Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not
2 become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted
as emergencies; and

Whereas, delay in the implementation of this change to the
6 law may prevent some licensed persons from practicing their
profession in barbering, cosmetology, manicuring or aesthetics;
and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts
create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of
12 Maine and require the following legislation as immediately
necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and
14 safety; now, therefore,

16 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

18 **Sec. 1. 32 MRSA §14203, sub-§2, ¶G,** as enacted by PL 1991, c.
397, §6, is amended to read:

20 G. On persons in their residences, ~~---if---the---licensee~~
22 ~~maintains-or-is-employed-in-a-licensed-shop;~~ and

24 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in the
preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

30 This bill removes the requirement that persons licensed to
practice barbering, cosmetology, manicuring or aesthetics must
32 maintain or be employed in a licensed shop in order to practice
on persons in their residences.
