An Act to Address Periodic Crises in the Preparation and Mailing of Checks to Clients of the Department of Human Services and to Ensure Priority Payment of Foster Care Expenses.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows: 2 Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §7066 is enacted to read: 4 §7066. Data entry and related personnel б 1. Authority of director. The director may require data entry personnel and other personnel involved in check preparation 8 for clients of state programs throughout State Government to 10 assist various state departments and agencies in the preparation and mailing of checks to clients of different programs by temporarily reassigning personnel to agencies in need of 12 assistance. 14 2. Cooperation by agencies. The heads of departments and other state agencies shall cooperate with the director in order 16 to accomplish the temporary reassignment of personnel authorized 18 under subsection 1. 2.0 3. Employee status. Any employee temporarily assigned to another department or agency under this section remains an employee of the department or agency to which the employee is 22 regularly assigned. 24 Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §3758, sub-§7 is enacted to read: 26 7. Priority of payments. Payments to recipients under this chapter have absolute priority and must be made without delay 28 whether or not they are pursuant to a state plan or contract 30 under 45 Code of Federal Regulations, Part 23. Sec. 3. 22 MRSA §4062, sub-§3 is enacted to read: 32 34 3. Priority of payments. The department shall ensure that payments for foster care made under this subchapter have the same priority as payments for aid to families with dependent children 36 pursuant to section 3758, subsection 7. 38 STATEMENT OF FACT 40 42 This bill allows the Director of the Bureau of Human Resources to draw data entry personnel and other personnel from other departments to assist in the preparation and mailing of 44 checks to clients of other departments. Since the several 46 departments often have different peak loads, personnel can be pooled to assist departments in addressing these peak loads. The 48 bill also requires that payment of foster care expenses have the same absolute priority as payment of aid to families with 50 dependent children.

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
