SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1629, L.D. 2292, Bill, "An Act Concerning the Bureau of Intergovernmental Drug Enforcement"

Amend the amendment in section 9 in that part designated "~~§2955.~~" in subsection 1 by striking out all of the 3rd sentence (page 4, lines 20 to 26 in amendment) and inserting in its place the following: 'The director--shall--be--appointed--by--the commissioner--from--a--list--of--at--least--3--persons--recommended--by--the board--and--shall--serve--at--the--pleasure--of--the--commissioner Chief of the State Police, the Maine Sheriffs' Association and the Maine Chiefs of Police Association may each nominate one candidate as director for submission to the Maine Drug Enforcement Agency Advisory Board. The advisory board shall submit one of the 3 nominations to the commissioner, who may appoint that person with the approval of the Governor. If the commissioner or the Governor does not approve of the candidate submitted, each of the nominating groups is requested to submit an additional nomination.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment changes the way in which the Director of the Maine Drug Enforcement Agency is selected.
