that delegation results in increased administrative costs.

The director may not issue requests for proposals for existing contract services until the director has adopted rules in 10 accordance with the Maine Administrative Procedure Act to ensure 12 that the reasons for which existing services are placed out for bid and the performance standards and manner in which compliance 14 is evaluated are specified and that any change in provider is accomplished in a manner that fully protects the consumer of 16 services.

18 Any new contract must be awarded through a request-for-proposal procedure and 1/3 of the contracts of \$100,000 per year or more 20 that are renewed must be awarded through a request-for-proposal procedure at least every 2 years.

The director shall establish a procedure to obtain assistance and advice from consumers of alcohol and other drug abuse services regarding the selection of contractors when requests for proposals are issued;

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill requires that any new contracts entered into and certain contracts renewed by the Office of Substance Abuse must be awarded through a request-for-proposal procedure. also requires the Director of the Office of Substance Abuse to establish a procedure to obtain assistance and advice from consumers of alcohol and other drug abuse services regarding the selection of contracts. The bill also corrects a conflict created by 2 public laws, Public Law 1991, chapters 557 and 601, amending the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, section 20005, subsection 6, paragraph B.
