#### Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §20005, sub-§5, as amended by PL 1991, c. 601, §6, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

4 6 §6, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
5. Budget. As provided in Title 5, section 1665, submit to the Bureau of the Budget a budget sufficient to carry out all state alcohol and drug abuse programs except those that must

8 remain with other departments and agencies in order to protect federal funding. Agencies and departments that have programs 10that must remain with them in order to protect federal funds 12 shall submit a copy of their budget request to the office, which shall make recommendations to the Governor concerning the request. A copy of any recommendations made during the budget 14biennium by these agencies and departments or by the Governor for 16 supplemental appropriations and allocations or deappropriations and reduced allocations must be submitted to the office so that 18 the office may make a recommendation to the Governor. <u>The</u> Governor shall obtain the recommendations of the office before 20 recommending any budget or budget revisions to the Legislature.

The office shall provide a complete recommended budget for all state alcohol and drug abuse programs to the Legislature for information purposes in January of the first year of each legislative biennium. This budget must show the original recommendations of any other agency or department with alcohol and drug abuse programs and the office's recommendations regarding them.

- 30 <u>All funds for support of state alcohol and drug abuse programs</u> <u>must be appropriated or allocated to the office except when doing</u> 32 <u>so would result in a loss of federal funding</u>;
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36 This bill clarifies and strengthens the position of the Office of Substance Abuse relative to state funds used for 38 substance abuse programs.

40 This bill provides that the office is the budgeting and recipient agency for all state substance abuse funds except those 42 that are required to remain with another agency to ensure the receipt of federal funding. Other departments or agencies that receive state substance abuse funds are to forward a copy of 44 their original and revised budgets to the Office of Substance 46 Abuse so that the office may make recommendations regarding them. The Governor may make no budgetary recommendations funds prior 48 concerning these to reviewing theoffice's recommendations. The office to iŝ required submit an 50 informational copy of its proposed budget directly to the Legislature.

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
