An Act to Require Economic Impact Criteria on State Procurement Procedure.



	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
2	Sec. 1. 5 MRSA §1825-B, sub-§7, as enacted by PL 1989, c. 785,
4	§2, is amended to read:
6	7. Basis for awards. Except as otherwise provided by law, orders awarded or contracts made by the State Purchasing Agent or
8	by any department or agency of the State must be awarded to-the lowestresponsiblebidder, taking into consideration the
10	qualities of the goods or services to be supplied, their conformity with the specifications, the purposes for which they
12	are required, the date of delivery, the information received pursuant to section 1825-D and the ultimate cost to the State.
14	If the bidder that was initially awarded the order or contract does not perform, the State Purchasing Agent may cancel the
16	contract and award a new contract to the -2nd -lowest -responsible another bidder. The order or contract may not be awarded to a
18	bidder that the State Purchasing Agent determined was not in compliance at the time the initial bid was submitted.

24	1-A. Request for information. For requesting information from bidders that includes, but is not limited to:
26	A. The amount of income taxes paid by the bidder to the State during the preceding and current tax years;

30	contract that would be paid by the bidder to the State;
32	C. Any effect on the employment of residents of this State;
34	D. The cost of monitoring the contract; and

38	STATEMENT OF FACT
40	This bill requires bidders for state contracts to furnish

financial information that would allow the State to assess the

fiscal impact of the contracts on the State.

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
