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HOUSE AMENDMENT "H" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1664, L.D. 2341, Bill, "An Act Regarding Advisory Boards and Occupational and Professional Licensing Boards"

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Amend the amendment by inserting after the title the following:

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'Amend the bill by striking out all of the first line after the enacting clause (page 1, line 23 in L.D.)

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Further amend the bill in Part A in section 6 in the first paragraph in the last line (page 4, line 34 in L.D.) by striking out the following: "Part" and inserting in its place the following: 'Act' '

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Further amend the amendment in the first paragraph after the title in the first line (page 1, line 17 in amendment) by striking out the following: "Amend" and inserting in its place the following: 'Further amend'

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Further amend the amendment on page 1 by striking out all of section A-8 (page 1, lines 21 to 43 in amendment) and inserting in its place the following:

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'Sec. A-8. Legislative review of statutory advisory boards. The Secretary of State shall submit legislation calling for the repeal of those advisory boards and commissions listed in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 5, sections 12004-I and 12004-J and any other advisory boards and commissions not listed in those sections whose responsibilities are comparable to the listed boards and commissions. The Secretary of State, in consultation with the Secretary of the Senate and the Clerk of the House of Representatives, shall group the repeal provisions for the advisory boards and commissions into separate pieces of legislation so as to allow review of each piece of legislation by the appropriate joint standing committee of the Legislature.

In considering legislation submitted by the Secretary of State under this Act, each joint standing committee of the 4 Legislature shall consider the following questions in evaluating the advisory boards contained in that legislation:' 6 Further amend the amendment on page 2 by striking out all of 8 the 2nd indented paragraph (page 2, lines 9 to 11 in amendment) and inserting in its place the following: 10 'Further amend the bill in Part A by renumbering the sections to read consecutively. 12 Further amend the bill by striking out all of Part B.' 14 Further amend the amendment by striking out all of the 16 fiscal note and inserting in its place the following: 18 'FISCAL NOTE 20 The Executive Department will incur some minor additional administrative costs to review boards and commissions established 22 by executive order or by informal action. The Department of Professional and Financial Regulation will also incur some minor 24 additional administrative costs to review and report on licensing 26 The Office of the Revisor of Statutes will incur some minor additional costs to review statutory references to boards. The Office of the Secretary of State will also incur additional 28 costs related to new quidelines for reporting on board activities 30 and submitting legislation to repeal inactive boards and advisory boards and commissions listed in the Maine Revised Statutes, 32 Title 5, sections 12004-I and 12004-J. These costs can be absorbed by the respective departments and agencies within their existing budgeted resources.' 34 36 STATEMENT OF FACT 38 40 This amendment changes the review process proposed in the committee amendment to retain the requirement for legislative review of advisory boards and commissions while eliminating the 42 automatic, delayed repeal of all those boards and commissions. 44
