IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-TWO

An Act to Grant Immunity for Directors of Rural Electrification Cooperatives.

(AFTER DEADLINE)

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2	Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:
-	Sec. 1. 14 MRSA §158-A, sub-§1, ¶A, as amended by PL 1989, c.
4	389, is further amended to read:
б	A. "Charitable organization" means any nonprofit organization organized or incorporated in this State or
8	having a principal place of business in this State:
10	(1) That is exempt from federal income taxation under the United States Internal Revenue Code, Section
12	501(a), because it is described in Section 501(c)(3),
14	 (4), (6) as it pertains to chambers of commerce only, (10), (13) or (14)(A), including all subsequent amendments to those paragraphs. An organization is
16	included in this subparagraph if it would be exempt from taxation under Section 501(c)(3) but for its
18	engaging in attempting to influence legislation to the
20	extent that it is disqualified from tax exemption under Section 501(c)(3); or

24	(a) Organized under the Maine Nonprofit Corporation Act for any of the purposes listed in
26	Title 13-B, section 201, subsection 1, paragraph A;
28	(b) Organized under the provisions set forth in Title 13-B, section 201, subsection 2, paragraph

32	(c) Organized under the provisions of Title 13-B, section 201, subsection 3, paragraph D or E; ΘF
34	(d) Organized in Maine as a nonprofit corporation

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STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides immunity from civil liability for elected, noncompensated directors of rural electrification cooperatives for acts or omissions within the scope of activities of the cooperatives. Created under federal and state law to enable electric service to reach remote areas, these cooperatives are owned by their members and are nonprofit.

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
