STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-TWO

An Act Relating to Gambling.

(AFTER DEADLINE)

(EMERGENCY)

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Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the laws affecting gambling activities within the State need to be amended immediately to allow once-a-year raffles with prizes worth between 10,000 and 75,000; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

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Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 1. 8 MRSA $\S372$, sub- $\S2$, $\P1$, as amended by PL 1989, c. 879, $\S\S1$ and 2 and affected by $\S4$, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

I. Carry on a continuous study and investigation of the lotteries throughout the State and the operation and administration of similar laws that may be in effect in other states or countries.

Sec. 2. 17 MRSA §331, sub-§8-A is enacted to read:

 28 <u>8-A. Special exempt raffles; prizes from \$10,000 to</u> \$75,000. The following rules apply to special exempt raffles
 30 licensed under this subsection.

32A. The Chief of the State Police may issue one special
exempt raffle license per year to any organization,
department or class eligible to hold a raffle under
subsection 6 without obtaining a license. The special36exempt raffle license entitles the licensee to hold one
raffle in which the holder of a winning chance receives38something of value worth more than \$10,000 but not more than
\$75,000. Section 341 does not apply to raffles licensed40under this section.

42 B. The Chief of the State Police may not issue a license under this subsection to hold a raffle in which the holder
44 of a winning chance receives a cash prize worth more than \$10,000.

C. All tickets sold pursuant to a special exempt raffle48license must be purchased from a licensed distributor or
licensed printer. Tickets must be sequentially numbered and
5050have printed on their faces the following information: the

Page 1-LR3695(1) L.D.2365 name of the special exempt raffle licensee; a description of the prize or prizes; the price of the ticket; and the date, time and place of the drawing. Any organization, department or class listed in subsection 6 that conducts a raffle under section 331-A shall retain all unsold raffle tickets for 6 months after the raffle drawing and make those tickets available for inspection at the request of the Chief of the State Police.

D. The Chief of the State Police may issue only one special exempt raffle license per year, either under this subsection or subsection 7, to the same organization, department or class listed in subsection 6.

Sec. 3. PL 1989, c. 879, §4 is repealed.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill repeals the language authorizing the State Lottery Director to enter into an agreement for Maine to participate in Lotto*America. The bill also enacts language allowing the Chief of the State Police to issue one special license per year to certain organizations to allow for a raffle with a prize worth more than \$10,000 but less than \$75,000.

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
