Sec. 1. 1 MRSA c. 33 is enacted to read:
CHAPTER 33
PROCEEDS FROM THE SALE OF BONDS
§2621. Use of proceeds from the sale of bonds
One-quarter of 1% of proceeds from the sale of any bond that
generates employment must be used to hire and provide support services to women in nontraditional occupations as defined in
Title 26, section 2022.
Sec. 2. 26 MRSA $\S2002$ , sub- $\S2$ , as enacted by PL 1983, c. 258, $\S1$ , is amended to read:
2. Expenditures. All meneys money in the fund shall must
be expended solely for the purposes of administering and implementing the provisions of the Job Training Partnership Act.
Twenty-five percent of all money expended from the fund must be expended as provided in subchapter III.

All funds under this subchapter shall <u>must</u> be distributed among the State's Job Training Partnership Act service delivery

to the private industry councils, in the service delivery areas, on a county-based formula determined by the Department of Labor.

Funds disbursed pursuant to this subchapter must be used for
1. Staff training. Staff training on nontraditional
occupations that includes differences in the economic status of
men and women; the social, personal and economic barriers that
women encounter in training, job placement and on the job;
methods for recruiting women for nontraditional occupations; and
the need for continuing support for women in nontraditional
occupations. A maximum of 1% of funds under this subchapter may
be used for staff training;

organizations for training and job placement services;

1. Budget review. Each agency with which the Department of
Labor contracts pursuant to section 2003 shall provide to the
Department of Labor an annual accounting of funds designated for nontraditional occupations that includes the amount spent on each

service provided. The Department of Labor shall review the budgets of these agencies to determine whether all the designated funds have been spent.

2. Redistribution of funds. The funds of an agency that fails to comply with this subchapter or that fails to use the full amount of funding provided must be redistributed to complying agencies. The redistribution must be made pursuant to a competitive process established by the Department of Labor.

#### §2027. Report

Each agency with which the Department of Labor contracts pursuant to section 2003 shall report annually in person to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over labor matters. The report must include statistics on participation; success rate in training and job placement including, but not limited to, data on the age and sex of participants and their job title and description; wage at the time of placement; examples of assessment tools developed; a summary of the budget for the preceding year; and the budget anticipated for the following year.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

 This bill requires that 25% of certain job training and placement funds be used to encourage women to pursue nontraditional occupations and to support them in those occupations. The bill also requires 1/4 of 1% of proceeds from the sale of any bond that generates employment be used to hire and provide services to women in nontraditional occupations.
