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Sec. E-5. Reorganization of labor and commerce services. It is the intent of the Legislature that the Department of Labor, the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation and the Department of Economic and Community Development be abolished on July 1, 1993. The functions of the Department of Labor, the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation and the Department of Economic and Community Development, Office of Business Development existing prior to that date are transferred to the newly created Department of Labor and Commerce.

The positions of Commissioner of Labor, Commissioner of Professional and Financial Regulation and Commissioner of Economic and Community Development are abolished.

Sec. E-6. Independent status. It is the intent of the Legislature that the agencies listed in the Maine Revised Statutes, Title 26, section 1408, subsection 5 are independent entities within State Government regardless of any administrative relationships described in law.

Sec. E-7. Transition provisions. The Commissioner of Labor, in consultation with the affected parties, shall submit the necessary implementing legislation to the Legislative Council no later than January 1, 1993. In addition to providing for the creation of the new Department of Labor and Commerce, the implementing legislation must provide for the appropriate reassignment of all community development responsibilities of the former Department of Economic and Community Development.

SENATE AMENDMENT "F" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 929, L.D. 2384

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

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This amendment adds a part to the committee amendment that creates a new department in State Government called the Department of Labor and Commerce. It abolishes the Department of Labor, the Department of Economic and Community Development and the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation. The new department assumes all the duties and functions of the Department of Labor, the Department of Professional and Financial Regulation and the Department of Economic and Community Development, except those portions dealing with community development. Additional commissions, boards and independent agencies are also added to the new department.
