SENATE AMENDMENT "I" to COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 929, L.D. 2384, Bill, "An Act to Restructure State Government"

Amend the amendment in Part A in section 5 in subsection 6 in the first line (page 5, line 12 in amendment) by inserting after the word "are" the following: 'not'

Further amend the amend in Part A in section 5 in subsection 6 in the 3rd to 6th lines (page 5 lines 14 to 17 in amendment) by striking out the following: "for each day's attendance at commission meetings and reimbursement for travel and other necessary expenses upon application to the Executive Director of the Legislative Council"

Further amend the amendment in Part A by striking out all of section 8 (page 9, lines 28 to 48 in amendment)

Further amend the amendment by striking out all of the fiscal note and inserting in its place the following:

FISCAL NOTE

Part A of the bill establishes the Commission on the Reorganization of Health, Social and Developmental Services, which will report out legislation to create 2 new state departments by merging several current departments and agencies. The members of the commission are not entitled to compensation for per diem or expenses. The Legislature can absorb staffing costs during any interim between sessions.

The Department of Human Services, the Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, the Office of Substance Abuse and the Office of Community Services can absorb the costs of providing information and assistance to the commission within existing budgeted resources.

2 The Interdepartmental Council will absorb the costs related
to a study of juvenile corrections services.

4 It can not be determined if any savings can be achieved
6 through the proposed reorganization.

8 The transfer of the Bureau of Rehabilitation, except the
duties and responsibilities of the Division of Disability and
10 Determination Services within the Department of Human Services,
to the Department of Education in Part B of the bill is required
12 to be accomplished with no additional funding.

14 Part C of the bill abolishes the State Planning Office in
fiscal year 1993-94 and establishes a Director of State Planning
16 in the office of the Governor. It can not be determined if there
will be future General Fund savings until the Legislature
18 determines the reassignment of current program components to
other state agencies.'
