An Act to Encourage Expansion of Certain Residency Programs Related to Primary Care Physicians.

42	STATEMENT OF FACT
44	
	In order to promote training of additional primary care
46	physicians, this bill excludes certain Medicare payments for primary care physician training from the ordinary calculations
48	made by the Maine Health Care Finance Commission to determine
50	hospital revenue limits. This special regulatory treatment applies only to residency spaces explicitly approved by the

commission with the advice of the Finance Authority of Maine's
Advisory Committee on Medical Education. It authorizes the
authority to apply available medical education funds to improve
curricula in primary care residency programs. The bill also
repeals recently enacted provisions for administering a program
for which funds are not available.
