## STATE OF MAINE SENATE 115TH LEGISLATURE SECOND REGULAR SESSION

SENATE AMENDMENT "C" to H.P. 1707, L.D. 2388, Bill, "An Act to Authorize Bond Issues for Transportation and Public Infrastructure Capital Improvements and Other Activities Designed to Create and Preserve Jobs for Maine Citizens"

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18 Amend the bill in Part A in section 1 by striking out in the 9th, 10th and 11th lines (page 1, lines 21 to 23 in L.D.) the 20 following: "public school buildings and grounds, public higher education facilities, group residential homes and rural health 22 clinics" and inserting in its place the following: 'and public school buildings and grounds'

Further amend the bill in Part A by striking out all of section 5 (page 2, lines 11 to 25 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. A-5. Disbursement of bond proceeds. The proceeds of the
bonds must be expended as set out in section 6 under the direction and supervision of the Commissioner of Economic and
Community Development for capital improvement projects for municipalities; the Chief Executive Officer of the Finance
Authority of Maine for an assistance program for small businesses threatened with loan recall resulting in foreclosure; and the
Commissioner of Education for public school capital improvement projects.'

Further amend the bill in Part A by striking out all of section 6 (page 2, lines 27 to 45 and page 3, lines 1 to 19 in L.D.) and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. A-6. Allocations from General Fund bond issue; public infrastructure capital improvements and other activities designed to create and preserve jobs for Maine citizens. The proceeds of the sale of bonds must be expended as designated in the following schedule.

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Debt service payments will come due in fiscal year 1992-93. A General Fund appropriation of approximately \$1,911,140 will be needed for the interest payments payable in fiscal year 1992-93. A Highway Fund allocation of \$1,170,400 will be needed for the interest payments payable in fiscal year 1992-93. These figures assume the first principal payment can be structured to be payable no sooner than fiscal year 1993-94 and that 2 interest payments will be payable in fiscal year 1992-93.'

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment deletes from the bill authorization for allocations from the sale of bonds for capital improvements to rural health clinics, the Maine Technical College System, the University of Maine System and residential group homes.

This amendment also adds a fiscal note.
