Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

Sec. 2. 7 MRSA §2151, as amended by PL 1989, c. 503, Pt. B, \$45, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

§2151. Creation and membership

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The Seed Potato Board, established by Title 5, section 12004-H, subsection 5, and referred to in this chapter as the "board," is located in the department and consists of the commissioner or the commissioner's designee, the Director of the Division of Plant Industry and 9 additional members, 8 of whom are appointed by the commissioner. Of the 8 appointed members, 7 must be chosen from representatives of the potato industry in Aroostook County and one from elsewhere in the State. One of the appointed members must be primarily a tablestock producer and one must be primarily a processor producer. The seed growers' executive council of the Maine Potato Board shall designate one of its members to serve as a full member of the board.

Sec. 3. 7 MRSA §2151-A is enacted to read:

§2151-A. Legislative findings and purpose

The Legislature finds that the Seed Potato Board is an essential component of the State's potato industry and therefore is necessary for the economic and social welfare of the State. The purpose of the board is to produce an adequate supply of vigorous, high quality prenuclear and nuclear seed stocks of the appropriate varieties of potatoes at a reasonable cost to growers. The Legislature finds that the activities of the board are central to the development and improvement of the State's potato industry.

Sec. 4. 7 MRSA §2152, as amended by PL 1983, c. 565, §4, is further amended to read:

§2152. Terms; vacancies; salaries

Each appointed member shall—serve serves for a term of 3 years or until his the member's successor has been appointed and qualified, except that no appointed member may serve for more

than 2 consecutive terms. The member designated by the seed growers' executive council serves until another person is designated.

Upon the expiration of the term of office of any appointed member of the board, said the member's successor shall must be appointed by the commissioner, or in case of a vacancy for any reason, the commissioner shall appoint a member to fill the unexpired term.

The members of the Seed Potato Board shall are entitled to receive ne-salary, but the legislative per diem and all their expenses incurred in attending meetings shall. Per diem and expenses must be paid out of the State Treasury, on eertificate certification of the commissioner, upon the audit and warrant of the State Controller.

Sec. 5. 7 MRSA §2153, as amended by PL 1983, c. 565, §5, is further amended to read:

§2153. Meetings; quorums

The Seed Potato Board shall meet annually on such a date and at such a place as the board may appoint and shall may also meet at such other times as the board may-deem determines necessary or when called by the chairman chair of the board or any 2 members thereof-upon of the board on 2 days' notice. The board may by resolution provide for a shorter notice to be made by telegraph, telephone or etherwise other appropriate means.

The presence at any meeting of at least 5 <u>6</u> members of the board shall-be-necessary-to-eenstitute <u>constitutes</u> a quorum, and the concurring votes of net-less-than a majority of the members present at any meeting shall-be <u>are</u> necessary to the-decision-of <u>decide</u> any question or issue or the authorization of any action.

Sec. 6. 7 MRSA §2154, as amended by PL 1985, c. 779, §37, is further amended to read:

\$2154. Powers; rules

The Seed Potato Board shall-have has the power and authority to produce, or cause to be produced through contract or otherwise, such-acreages the acreage of foundation nuclear seed potatoes of various varieties as it may from time-to-time determine appropriate for distribution and sale to the potato growers of this State. The commitments of the board shall may not exceed in the aggregate the amount of funds to which may-be-made available-to-it the board has access. In-addition, the-beard shall-be-advisory-te-and-shall-have-authority-te-work-with-and

The board may, subject to laws and procedures generally applicable to state agencies, except as otherwise provided in this chapter, enter into contracts or agreements in furtherance of its legislative purposes with public and private entities. The contracts or agreements include, but are not limited to, those relating to the lease or purchase of office space, facilities, property, equipment or supplies as the board determines are necessary for its purposes. The board may delegate to its program director the power to enter into contracts and agreements, subject to the The board shall--have has authority to board's oversight. purchase, own or otherwise acquire farm real estate and farm equipment if necessary for the purpose of producing aereages-ef feundatien nuclear seed potatoes or providing for the testing thereof of them, and any salable material resulting from the ownership or operation may be sold to the best advantage of the board. The board shall-have has authority to sell or otherwise convey farm real estate and farm equipment no longer required for the purposes of this chapter. Proceeds from the sale shall must be credited to the operating account of the board.

The board shall-have has the responsibility-and-full-power and authority to make adopt, in-a-manner-consistent-with pursuant to the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, rules and-regulations net-inconsistent consistent with law pertaining to its program of production, distribution and sales of foundation nuclear seed potatoes to the potato growers of the Stater-as-it-may-from-time to-time-determine,-including,-but-not-limited-to, . The board is-authorized-to may pay to the Town of Masardis in lieu of taxes a sum, that in the discretion of the board, which will compensate the town in whole or in part for loss of real estate taxes due to state ownership of real estate new used for seed potato purposes.

Sec. 7. 7 MRSA §2155, sub-§1, as amended by PL 1985, c. 785, Pt. B, §47, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:

1. Administration. The board shall appoint a program director who is the board's chief operating officer and who serves at the pleasure of the board. The board may employ additional full-time staff as it determines necessary to carry out the programs of the board. The program director has the authority to employ such additional intermittent, seasonal and part-time staff and casual employees as may be necessary to carry out the purposes and the functions of the board. The staff and employees of the board are not subject to the Civil Service Law. The salary paid to the program director and other full-time staff of the board must be fixed by the board subject to the approval of the Governor. Other terms and conditions of employment for the program director and the full-time staff are those provided by law and those granted by the Governor to employees who are excluded from bargaining and whose salaries are established or approved by the Governor. The board has the authority to establish all terms and conditions of employment for part-time, seasonal, intermittent and casual employees subject to applicable state and federal laws. The board may delegate to its program director authority to execute the board's policies and programs subject to regular oversight by the board. The board shall keep a record of all its proceedings and shall ensure that records of all expenses incurred by the board are kept. Expenses incurred by the board must be paid out of the State Treasury, on certification of the commissioner, on the audit and warrant of State Controller and charged against any and all appropriations available for its use as stipulated. The board is subject to the provisions of Title 5, chapter 379.

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Sec. 8. 7 MRSA $\S2155$, sub- $\S2$, as enacted by PL 1983, c. 565, $\S7$, is amended to read:

2. Program plan. The managing program director shall present to the board, at least annually, a program plan for the board's consideration and specific action,—which . The plan shall must include an assessment of the seed potato industry, a projection of demand for seed by variety in the various marketing areas, the impact of significant changes in seed potato acreage, the capital needs of the state seed potato farm, considering current and future technology, proposals to improve the varieties and quality of Maine seed potatoes, recommendations to promote the sale of Maine seed, and to other such matters the managing program director deems determines appropriate.
