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There is created and established the Department of Public Safety to coordinate and efficiently manage the law enforcement and public safety responsibilities of the State, to consist of the Commissioner of Public Safety, in this chapter called "commissioner," who shall--be is appointed by the Governor, subject to review by the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local government matters and to confirmation by the Legislature, to serve at the pleasure of the Governor, and the following as--ereated--and established: the Bureau of State Police, the Bureau of Liquor Enforcement, the Office of the State Fire Marshal, the Maine Criminal Justice Academy, the Maine Highway Safety Commission, the Bureau of Highway Safety and---the---Bureau---of Intergovernmental-Drug-Enforcement.

- Maine Highway Safety Commission. The Maine Highway Safety Commission, as authorized by Title 5, section 12004-I, subsection 83, is under the direction of the Commissioner of Public Safety and advisory to the Governor. The commission consists of not more than 25 members selected by the Governor from state, civic and industrial organizations and individuals with interests related to highway safety. The Commissioner of Public Safety, the Commissioner of Transportation, the Commissioner of Human Services, the Commissioner of Education, the Secretary of State and the Attorney General serve as ex officio members. The ex officio members shall appoint persons in major policy-influencing positions as their designees to represent them at meetings of the commission with voting privileges. The commission members serve at the pleasure of the Governor and are entitled to compensation in accordance with Title 5, chapter 379. The commission shall stimulate active support for highway safety measures and programs and advise the Department of Public Safety regarding these issues. commission shall report annually its findings recommendations, including any necessary implementing legislation, to the Governor and to the joint standing committee of the Legislature having jurisdiction over state and local government matters; and
