STATE OF MAINE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES 115TH LEGISLATURE SECOND REGULAR SESSION

HOUSE AMENDMENT "H" to HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1772, 14 L.D. 2454, Bill, "An Act to Provide Skills Training for Unemployed Workers"

Amend the amendment by inserting after the title the 18 following:

20 'Amend the bill by striking out the title and substituting the following:

'An Act to Provide Skills Training for Unemployed Workers and to 24 Promote Research and Development''

Further amend the amendment in the first paragraph after the title in the first line (page 1, line 16 in amendment) by striking out the following: "Amend" and inserting in its place the following: "Further amend"

Further amend the amendment by inserting after the first 32 paragraph after the title the following:

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'Sec. 1. 36 MRSA §1760, sub-§14 is repealed.'

Further amend the amendment by striking out all of sections 3 and 4 and inserting in their place the following:

'Sec. 3. Use of funds for research and development programs.
Beginning in fiscal year 1992-93, the funds raised by the repeal of the sales tax exemption on short-term publications provided in this Act are dedicated for use by the University of Maine System for research and development programs established in this Act.
Those funds do not lapse and carry forward from year to year to carry out those research and development purposes.

Sec. 4. Use of funds for retraining programs. For fiscal years 1992-93 and 1993-94 the funds raised by the increase in the sales tax from 6% to 7% on food sold in establishments not licensed for the on-premises sale of liquor provided in this Act are dedicated to fund Maine Technical College System programs to

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provide skills training established in this Act for unemployed workers. Beginning in fiscal year 1994-95 those funds must be paid to the General Fund.

Sec. 5. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

Provides funds for research and development 18 biotechnology initiatives in at the University of Maine and the University of Southern Maine. At the University of Maine 20 biotechnology research is in the areas of agriculture, natural resources, 22 and the environment focusing on commercially viable species for Maine. At the University of 24 Southern Maine, research is in immunology 26 and molecular biology with a focus on the medical sciences. These initiatives are designed to enhance research efforts in 28 technology these areas and facilitate 30 transfer and the development of research and training collaboratives between the 32 university and the private sector. The centers would work closely with the Maine Science and Technology Commission and the 34 Center for Innovation in Biomedical 36 Technology.

Provides funds for initiatives designed to 42 strengthen the capacity of the University of Maine and University of Southern Maine to 44 help Maine firms manage the process of technology innovation. These initiatives 46 are designed to assist Maine firms in 48 adapting cutting-edge technologies and manufacturing techniques to improve their 50 national and international competitive

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positions and to assist in the establishment of a regional technology transfer consortium. The two campuses would work closely with the Maine Science and Technology Commission and the Center for Technology Transfer.

12 Provides funds to coordinate and integrate resources across all programs of the 14 University of Maine and the University of Maine related Southern to economic 16 development. Community-specific data bases and 22 community economic profiles will be communities developed to · assist in strategies 24 identifying for change. STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment repeals the tax exemption on short-term publications, dedicates the money raised by repeal of that 16 exemption and appropriates money to the University of Maine 18 for research and development in the areas of System manufacturing technology, economic development biotechnology, programs 20 rural health programs. The amendment also and appropriates funds to the Maine Technical College System to 22 provide skills training for unemployed workers.
