- 8. Exceptions. Those persons and individuals licensed for the aquaculture of Atlantic salmon are exempt from this section, except that they shall report to the department the number and weight of all Atlantic salmon within the department's jurisdiction sold and the location to which they are sold. The department shall abide by the confidentiality rules adopted in the same manner as provided for the Commissioner of Marine Resources under section 6173.
- 9. Agent's fee. Any clerk or agent appointed by the department to issue an Atlantic salmon license shall retain \$1 for each license issued.
 - 10. Use of license fees. All proceeds, less necessary expenses for issuing and processing licenses, must be paid to the Treasurer of State as undedicated revenue to the General Fund.
- 18 <u>II. Duplicates.</u> The department or its agents shall issue a duplicate license to any person who has accidentally lost or destroyed an Atlantic salmon license upon payment of a fee of \$1 that must be retained by the issuing agent. Atlantic salmon tags bearing the license number of a lost or destroyed license are considered invalid.
 - 12. Fishing in inland waters. When fishing in inland waters, the holder of a license authorized under this section is subject to all the provisions of chapters 701 to 721.

It is unlawful to possess, ship or transport an Atlantic salmon that has not been properly registered according to this section by the person who killed the fish.

- 1. Time period. Within 12 hours, except as provided in subsection 4, the person who killed the salmon shall present the salmon for registration. The salmon must be registered at the first open salmon registration station on the route taken by the person killing the fish.
- 2. Information requirements. The person who killed the fish must register the fish in that person's own name. Information concerning each salmon registered must be reported accurately and truthfully.
- 3. Possession of unlabeled parts unlawful. It is unlawful to possess any part of an Atlantic salmon taken from the inland or coastal waters of this State, unless each part is plainly labeled with the name and address of the person who registered the fish, except those fish properly identified in section 7163, subsection 7.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill abolishes the Atlantic Sea Run Salmon Commission and places the powers and duties formerly held by the commission under the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. To accomplish this, the bill repeals the Maine Revised Statues, Title 12, chapter 611, which falls under the marine resources laws, and enacts similar language in the statutes governing the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife. The bill provides for the transfer of property, contracts, records, equipment and the like, but does not authorize the transfer of positions of the staff currently assigned to the commission to the department.
