26	(1) Properly registered ATV's may operate on a public way only the distance necessary, but in no case to

26	STATEMENT OF FACT
28	This amendment replaces the language of the original bill.
30	The amendment allows a law enforcement officer to operate an all-terrain vehicle on the extreme right of a public way from the
32	place where it is normally stored to an off-road area to be patrolled.
