**An Act to Permit the Use of All-terrain Vehicles by Law Enforcement Officers.**

---



2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

4 Sec. 1. 29 MRSA §906 is enacted to read:

6 §906. Use of ATV by law enforcement officer

8 Notwithstanding section 242, subsection 1, paragraphs E and  
10 E-1 and Title 12, sections 7856 and 7857, a law enforcement  
12 officer may operate an all-terrain vehicle, as defined in Title  
14 12, section 7851, subsection 2, on a public way or private road  
16 during the scope of and while engaged in employment as a law  
18 enforcement officer.

20 **STATEMENT OF FACT**

This bill allows a law enforcement officer to operate an ATV on public ways and private roads when engaged in employment as a law enforcement officer.
