STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE

Resolve, Authorizing Albert W. Hallowell to Bring a Civil Action against the State.



Sec. 1. Authorization to sue the State. Resolved: That, notwithstanding any statute or common law to the contrary, Albert W. Hallowell, or his legal representative, who claims to have suffered damages as a result of the State's failure to properly pay overtime compensation between 1975 and 1983, is authorized to bring a civil action against the State, but not against individual past or present employees of the State.

This action may be brought in the Knox County Superior Court within one year from the date this resolve is approved. Liability and damages must be determined according to state law as in litigation between individuals. Recovery for actual damages is limited to \$9,845.89, plus costs and interest. The action may be heard by a Justice of the Superior Court or by a jury. The Maine Rules of Civil Procedure govern the conduct of the action. The Attorney General shall appear, answer and defend the action.

The Treasurer of State shall pay any judgment, including costs and interest, on final process issued by the Superior Court or, if applicable, the Supreme Judicial Court.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This resolve authorizes Albert W. Hallowell to sue the State for damages of \$9,845.89 for amounts Mr. Hallowell alleges are due him in unpaid compensation for overtime worked as a boat captain for the Department of Marine Resources.
