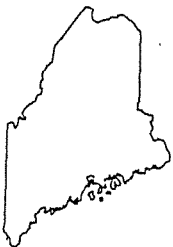

An Act to Provide Restitution for Vandalism.



Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

2
4 Sec. 1. 15 MRSA §3314, sub-§3-B is enacted to read:

6 3-B. Restitution for certain crimes. When a juvenile has
8 been adjudicated as having committed a juvenile crime under
10 section 3103, subsection 1, paragraph A for commission of an
12 offense defined in Title 17-A, section 805 or 806, the court
14 shall order that restitution be made to the victim or the
16 victim's subrogee for the economic loss sustained, in accordance
18 with the provisions of Title 17-A, chapter 54.

20 To effectuate the purpose of this subsection, the juvenile shall
22 register a current address with the court every 6 months, notify
24 the court immediately of any change of address and, upon
26 obtaining employment, shall notify the court of the employer's
28 address and the terms of employment.

30 Nothing in this subsection limits the court from imposing one or
32 more of the other dispositional alternatives provided in
34 subsection 1, as it finds appropriate.

STATEMENT OF FACT

36 This bill requires that the court order restitution be paid
38 to victims or their subrogees by juveniles found guilty of
aggravated criminal mischief or criminal mischief, as soon as the
juveniles have the means to pay.
