STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND NINETY-THREE

An Act to Permit the Saco River Corridor Commission to Adopt Ordinances Governing Alcohol Use within the Corridor.

(EMERGENCY)

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Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the Saco River is an important natural resource, which is threatened by misuse of alcohol by some of the river's recreational users; and

8 Whereas, it is necessary for the Saco River Corridor 10 Commission to enact rules controlling this behavior as soon as possible; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

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Sec. 1. 38 MRSA §954-C, sub-§3 is enacted to read:

 Rules to regulate alcohol. The commission may adopt
 rules in accordance with Title 5, chapter 375, subchapter II to regulate the use or possession of alcoholic beverages on land and
 water within the Saco River Corridor. Rules adopted under this subsection preempt municipal ordinances governing the same
 activities. In addition to other law enforcement officials authorized to enforce this chapter, municipal law enforcement
 officials are specifically authorized to enforce rules adopted pursuant to this subsection.

Sec. 2. 38 MRSA §961, as affected by PL 1989, c. 890, Pt. A, 34 §40 and amended by Pt. B, §204, is further amended to read:

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§961. Relation to municipal, state and federal regulations

Nething Except as provided in section 954-C, subsection 3, 38 nothing in this chapter prevents municipal, state or federal authorities from adopting and administering more stringent 40 requirements regarding performance standards or permitted uses 42 within use districts established by the commission or within districts overlapping the districts established pursuant to this 44 chapter. Where Except as provided in section 954-C, subsection 3, when there is a conflict between a provision adopted under and any other municipal, state federal 46 this chapter or requirement applicable to the same land or water areas within the corridor, the more restrictive provision takes precedence. All 48 performance standards, rules and regulations proposed for hearing 50 by the commission must be submitted to the Commissioner of

Environmental Protection, the State Planning Office, the Greater
Portland Council of Governments and the Southern Maine Regional Planning Commission at least 7 days prior to the hearing for
review and comment. The commission shall may not promulgate adopt any rule establishing air or water quality standards within
the corridor in conflict with the rules of the Department-of Environmental-Protection department without the prior approval of
the Board of Environmental Protection.

Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act takes effect when approved.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill grants authority to the Saco River Corridor Commission to regulate the use of alcohol on land and water within the corridor. It authorizes the commission to adopt rules to regulate that behavior, provides that the rules preempt municipal ordinances related to alcohol use and specifically authorizes municipal law enforcement officials to enforce those rules.

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
